

2020 Fairfield County Modified Junior Fair General Rules & Health Care Operations

GENERAL RULES:

1. Fully cooperate with the Senior Fair Board, Junior Fair Board, OSU Extension, Fairfield County 4-H Program, and local FFA Chapters. Fully cooperate with the Fairfield County Department of Health and Ohio Department of Health Guidelines.
2. The Fairfield County Senior Fair Board has set a 10 p.m. curfew for the grounds each day as requested by Governor Mike DeWine. At 10 p.m., no exhibitors or parents should be in the buildings so cleaning can take place.
3. Animals will be released following their show for both market and breeding except for Champion and Reserve Champions. The exact time you can remove your animals will be determined by Junior Fair Director and Superintendents. Times will be announced when they are confirmed. This information can be found in your species-specific best practices document.
4. Due to COVID-19, the [2019 Junior Fair Rules](#) will be used for 2020 unless otherwise announcement by your species Superintendent. Please refer to these rules on the Fairfield County 4-H website (fairfield.osu.edu) or the Fairfield County Fair website (fairfieldcountyfair.org).
5. **CAMPING** – Camping will be only be allowed for parents of Junior Fair 4-H and FFA families that have a current camping contract as approved at the September 15th, 2020 Senior Fair Board Meeting. Please contact the Senior Fair Office for details.
6. **ADMISSION** – Wristbands will be provided for admission into the 2020 Fairfield County Junior Fair. The fair will not be open to the public.
 - a. Each Junior Fair Exhibitor and their immediate family, Superintendents, Show Committee Members, and 4-H/FFA Advisors will receive wristbands which will be good for the week of the fair.
 - b. Wristbands are not for extended family and friends, breeders, or spectators of any kind. Family members and friends as spectators are encouraged to stay home to keep attendance down so that crowding in barns and show arenas does not happen.
 - c. The Senior Fair Board is working on live and recorded options of all shows and events to share on multiple media outlets so family, friends, and the general public can still watch shows from home, safely.
 - d. Admission to the fairgrounds will occur through one of two gates: Broad Street and High Street.
 - e. Livestock Sale Buyers who have a parking pass will be allowed to enter the fairgrounds on Thursday and Friday during the fair. If a buyer has purchased in 2019, they will receive a pass to get into the sale. If a buyer is new, reach out to the Sale Committee in order to receive a parking pass.

MODIFIED JUNIOR FAIR HEALTH CARE OPERATIONS

- Consider the types of interactions that will occur at the event and if contact between attendees can be limited to help stop the spread of COVID-19.
- Maintain at least 6 feet of distancing between individuals/those not in your household whenever feasible.
- Masks are an effective means of preventing transmission of COVID-19 from people who feel fine and are not showing symptoms but are able to infect others.
- Per the health order from Governor Mike DeWine, effective July 23, 2020 at 6 p.m., masks are required to be worn in Ohio. This applies to all indoor program activities and outdoor activities where 6 feet of distancing cannot be assured.

AS WE RETURN TO IN-PERSON MODIFIED FAIR ACTIVITIES, THE FOLLOWING PRINCIPLES WILL BE USED:

- The health and safety of Ohio communities is our priority.
- Transparency is essential – clear expectations must be communicated in a timely manner.
- We know that concerns about the spread of coronavirus have changed how people interact with each other. Because of this, those who organize meetings and events have a responsibility to take into account the health and safety of attendees.

PRACTICE GOOD HYGIENE

- Wash your hands often, with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after touching any frequently used item or surface.
- Avoid touching your face or others in attendance.
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue or the inside of your elbow.
- Provide hand sanitizer that contains at least 70% alcohol at a registration table or at a table near the entrance to the meeting room.

MONITOR YOUR HEALTH

- Be alert for symptoms: fever, cough, shortness of breath.
- Do not attend in-person activities if you or anyone living in your household is experiencing symptoms associated with the coronavirus, or any other communicable illness.
- Follow CDC/ODH guidance if symptoms develop.
