

2020 Fairfield County Junior Fair Updates

Book 1 – Dairy Cattle

ARRIVAL TIME:

- Dairy Feeders must be stalled by 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 11th.
- Dairy Breeding can be stalled starting after 3:00 p.m. on Monday, October 12th through 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 14th.

HOUSING:

- All animals will be in penned in their designated space.
- No decorations will be put in the barn.
- Families will be penned together.
- Due to social distancing guidelines, there will be one pen in between families. This pen will NOT be used – no animals or tack in this pen.
- Masks or facial coverings will be REQUIRED while in the barns at all times please observe social distancing of 6 feet.
- Barns/Fairgrounds close at 10:00 p.m. each night.
- No exhibitor/parent/guardian/advisor should be in the barns after 10:00 p.m. in order for cleaning to take place.

BEDDING: Straw Only. Tack should be removed by 12:00 p.m. on Thursday, October 15th.

WEIGH-IN/CHECK-IN TIMES:

- Dairy Feeder Weigh-in will be on Sunday, October 11th from 4:00 – 5:00 p.m. in the Round Cattle Barn.
 - DUNF forms are required for all Dairy Feeders.
 - DUNF forms should be completed as close to fair weigh-in as possible to ensure the information submitted is correct.
 - Exhibitors need to submit a DUNF form for EACH animal.
 - DUNF forms must be completed online BEFORE weigh-in:

 - Exhibitors will receive an email receipt after submitting their online DUNF form.
 - Exhibitors will be asked to show a copy of this receipt (with exhibitor name and tag number) for each animal at weigh-in. This can be done by printing off the email receipt or showing the Show Committee the email receipt on a smartphone.
 - If an exhibitor submits an online DUNF in error (i.e. incorrect species, incorrect tag number), they must notify Leslie Cooksey (cooksey.25@osu.edu) and submit a new DUNF with the correct information.

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- Dairy Feeder Release Forms will be filled out by all dairy feeder exhibitors and turned in to the Superintendent by 8:00 p.m. on Monday, October 12th. This form allows exhibitors to indicate if they DO or DO NOT accept the packer bid for dairy feeders.
 - There may be an individual feedlot (packer) bid for dairy feeder calves. The bids may vary by breed and weight, and exhibitors will be given their bid at weigh-in on Sunday, at which time they must accept or reject the bid of their animal. All calves choosing to accept their bid must be vaccinated at weigh-in, at the exhibitor's expense. The proper vaccines, chosen by the feedlot (packer) bidder and veterinarian, will be administered by a veterinarian.
- Dairy Breeding – N/A
 - Breed Association Papers will be checked by the Superintendent before show.
 - DUNF forms will be completed online for lactating dairy cows.
 - DUNF forms should be completed as close to fair weigh-in as possible to ensure the information submitted is correct.
 - Exhibitors need to submit a DUNF form for EACH lactating dairy animal.
 - DUNF forms must be completed online BEFORE check-in:

 - Exhibitors will receive an email receipt after submitting their online DUNF form.
 - Exhibitors will be asked to show a copy of this receipt (with exhibitor name and tag number) for each animal at check-in. This can be done by printing off the email receipt or showing the Show Committee the email receipt on a smartphone.
 - If an exhibitor submits an online DUNF in error (i.e. incorrect species, incorrect tag number), they must notify Leslie Cooksey (cooksey.25@osu.edu) and submit a new DUNF with the correct information.

SHOWMANSHIP: Showmanship sign-ups will be done via an electronic survey that will be shared with all exhibitors. Classes will be broken by age. Link to sign-up for showmanship: <http://go.osu.edu/fc2020showmanship>

- Dairy Feeder Exhibitors have until 12:00 p.m. on Monday, October 12th to sign up.
- Dairy Breeding Exhibitors have until 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, October 13th to sign up.

SHOW TIME:

- The Dairy Feeder Show will be in the Round Cattle Barn Show Arena starting at 8:30 a.m. on Tuesday, October 13th.
- The Dairy Cattle Show will be in the Round Cattle Barn Show Arena starting at 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, October 14th.

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AUCTION: Thursday, October 15th at 5:00 p.m., Feeder Creek Vet Show Arena

- Junior Fair Livestock Auction Session 1: Market Beef, Dairy Products, Dairy Feeders, Market Swine
- There will continue to be 6 individual sale slots for Dairy Beef Feeder exhibitors.
 - Overall Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Dairy Feeders, will sell first and second, respectively. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Dairy Feeders will sell to a designated packer and will not have the option to take home. Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Dairy Feeders will go through the sale ring.
 - The remaining 4 sale slots will be determined at the show with overall placings. These animals will not go through the sale ring and will sell for premium bid only. The exhibitors of these animals can either take home or accept dairy feeder packer bid. Paperwork to accept/deny dairy feeder packer bid must be completed by 8:00 p.m. on Monday, October 12th.
 - Dairy Feeders will follow Dairy Products at the sale.
- No adults will be able to represent an exhibitor in the sale ring.
- An exhibitor or representative must be present in their assigned sale slot in order to collect their premium bid.

RELEASE TIME:

- Grand and Reserve Grand Champion Dairy Feeders will be released to the #50 Show Arena until sale day (Thursday). Exhibitors are required to continue taking care of their animals (including feeding and watering them) in the Champion Barn until Thursday evening.
- Dairy Feeders that will be taken home (denied packer bid) will be released immediately after the Dairy Feeder Show. (Take home) Dairy Feeders must leave the fairgrounds no later than 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 14th.
- Dairy Feeders that accepted the packer bid will be released on Tuesday around 6:00 p.m. to the winning packer bidder.
- All Dairy Breeding Cattle will be released immediately after completion of the show and must leave the fairgrounds no later than 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 14th.

PREMIUMS: Premiums will not be issued for 2020.

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ADDITIONAL RULES:

1. Classes will have no more than 8-10 head per class/heat.
2. There will be no physical contact between the judge and the exhibitors.
3. Exhibitors in the ring and the judge will not be required to wear a mask, but everyone else will be wearing a mask in the building.
4. Social Distancing – There is plenty of space in the barn and arena to spread out and try to maintain 6 feet of separation between each exhibitor.
5. Announcements will be made during the show to remind spectators, families and exhibitors to stay socially distanced.
6. Spectators will only be allowed in the show arena while their exhibitor is showing. Spectators are **REQUIRED** to wear a mask, must be socially distanced from other families and must leave the building when their exhibitor's class is over. Spectators can stand around the ring or sit in the marked areas of the permanent bleachers, leaving at least 6 feet distance from the next family unit. This will be strictly enforced. Failure to comply with these standards could result in removal from the grounds or the show being stopped.
7. Hand Sanitizing stations will be available for exhibitors, families and show volunteers. Please be aware of their location and use them as needed to keep your hands clean.
