

2020 Fairfield County Junior Fair Updates

ARRIVAL TIME: Market Hog Arrival & Weigh-In is Saturday, October 10th from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

- Hogs will be weighed off the trailer and then placed in assigned pens.
 - Stay with your trailer until you weigh in.
- All animals must be weighed and in place by 1:00 p.m.

TRAFFIC PATTERN: See map below.

- Enter off of W Fair Ave and N Broad St (Main Fair Entrance) OR via Wilson Ave.
- Exit on N Columbus St.



HOUSING:

- This year we will be utilizing the Swine Barn as well as the L Barn (horse barn) to house projects during the time they are on the fairgrounds.
- If clubs want to be penned together, the advisor must contact Superintendent, Greg Grube (send a text to 740-808-1058 or email caseih400@msn.com) by Friday, September 25th. Clubs requesting to be penned together will be penned in the L Barn.
- Exhibitors whose advisors did not request to pen together, will be assigned pens starting in the Swine Barn. These exhibitors will be penned alphabetically by last name. Overflow will then be penned in the L Barn.
- There will be a gated walkway in between the Swine Barn and L Barn for exhibitors to use to take hogs to the wash rack or to the Feeder Creek Vet Arena for their class. Due to this walkway, upon entering the barn for weigh-in, traffic will be directed to stay on the pavement and go around the L Barn to the Swine Barn – you will not drive in between the two barns.

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- No decorations will be put in either barn.
- Families will be penned together.
- Due to social distancing guidelines there will be one pen in between families. This pen will NOT be used – no pigs or tack in this pen.
- Masks or facial coverings will be REQUIRED while in the barns at all times please observe social distancing of 6 feet.
- Barns/Fairgrounds close at 10 p.m. each night. No exhibitor/parent/guardian/advisor should be in the barns after 10 p.m. in order for cleaning to take place.

BEDDING: Only bedding to be used will be shavings.

WEIGH-IN TIMES: Saturday, October 10th from 8:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m.

- DUNF forms are required for market and MQP hogs.
- DUNF forms should be completed as close to fair weigh-in as possible to ensure the information submitted is correct.
- Exhibitors need to submit a DUNF for EACH animal.
- DUNF forms must be completed online BEFORE weigh-in:

 - Exhibitors will receive an email receipt after submitting their online DUNF form.
 - Exhibitors will be asked to show a copy of this receipt (with exhibitor name and tag number) for each animal at weigh-in. This can be done by printing off the email receipt or showing the Show Committee the email receipt on a smartphone.
 - If an exhibitor submits an online DUNF in error (i.e. incorrect species, incorrect tag number), they must notify Leslie Cooksey (cooksey.25@osu.edu) and submit a new DUNF with the correct information.
- [Take Home Form](#) must be turned in before the hog leaves the scale.
- [“No Ractopamine/Paylean” Affidavit](#) must be turned in at weigh-in.

SHOWMANSHIP: Showmanship sign-ups will be done via an electronic survey that will be shared with all exhibitors and posted on the Facebook page (Fairfield County Junior Swine Barn). Exhibitors have until 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, October 11th to sign up.

SHOW TIME:

- Showmanship will be in the Feeder Creek Vet Show Arena starting at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 11th. Show order will go from oldest class to youngest class
- Market Show will be in the Feeder Creek Vet Show Arena starting at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, October 12th.

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AUCTION: Thursday, October 15th at 5:00 p.m., Feeder Creek Vet Show Arena

- Junior Fair Livestock Auction Session 1: Market Beef, Dairy Products, Dairy Feeders, Market Hogs
- Only the Grand and Reserve Champion Market Hogs will go through the sale ring. Grand and Reserve Champions can be “turns” or “keeps”. If a buyer chooses to keep (purchase the meat), they will pay premium and packer price. Grand and Reserve Champion Market Hogs must go to the designated packer facility following the sale (Bay Packing).
- No other Market Hogs will go through the sale ring. They will sell for premium bid only.
- Each exhibitor (or a Junior Fair representative) is required to be at the sale except for members in group, however they are still welcome to come.
- No adults will be able to represent an exhibitor in the sale ring.
- An exhibitor or representative must be present in their assigned sale slot in order to collect their premium bid.

RELEASE TIME:

- Take Home Hogs: At the start of Market Swine Show, an announcement will be made letting exhibitors know when take home animals can leave the fairgrounds. Take Home Hogs will be expected to haul out the day of the show by 10:00 p.m.
- The Livestock Sale Committee will notify the Swine Committee when the packer truck will arrive for hogs going directly to the packer. This information will be shared with exhibitors as soon as it is confirmed. Exhibitors will be expected to take care of their animals until the packer truck loads out.
- Grand and Reserve Champions will be released to the #50 Show Arena. Exhibitors are required to continue taking care of their animals (including feeding and watering them) in the Champion Barn until Friday evening.

PREMIUMS: Premiums will not be issued for 2020.

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ADDITIONAL RULES:

1. As a reminder, all market hogs will need to be ractopamine (Paylean) free to exhibit at the 2020 Fairfield County Junior Fair. This was approved at the January 2020 Senior Fair Board Meeting. All exhibitors will be required to turn in a signed affidavit at weigh-in stating that they have never fed ractopamine to their market hog(s).

5. Market Classes will be broken by weight. Barrows and gilts will show separately. The Swine Committee will do their best to keep classes small in size, around 10 or less in each class. Class breaks will be posted ASAP on Sunday.
6. There will be no physical contact between the judge and the exhibitors.
7. Exhibitors in the ring and the judge will not be required to wear a mask, but everyone else is expected to wear a mask in the building.
8. Announcements will be made during the show to remind spectators, families and exhibitors to stay socially distanced.
9. Spectators will only be allowed in the show arena while their exhibitor is showing. Spectators are REQUIRED to wear a mask, must be socially distanced from other families and must leave the building when their exhibitor's class is over. Spectators can stand around the ring or sit in the marked areas of the permanent bleachers, leaving at least 6 feet distance from the next family unit. This will be strictly enforced. Failure to comply with these standards could result in removal from the grounds or the show being stopped.
10. Hand Sanitizing stations will be available for exhibitors, families and show volunteers. Please be aware of their location and use them as needed to keep your hands clean.
