**PLEASE NOTE:** Once registration is submitted, if a camper cannot attend camp due to COVID-19 restrictions (isolation or quarantine), they will be refunded their camp fee. If a camper does not attend camp for any other reason, they will be charged the full camp rate of \$40 (Cloverbud) or \$80 (Intermediate/Junior). This is to reimburse the sponsor for the campership that member received.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

- Campers must provide their own transportation to and from all camps.
  - Cloverbud Camp will be from 9am-4pm on June 5
  - Junior Camp will be from 9am-4pm on June 29-July 1
  - Intermediate Camp will be from 9am-4pm on June 15-16 and from 9am-8pm on June 17
- *Cloverbud, Intermediate, and Junior Camps* are held at Alley Park, 2805 Old Logan Rd, Lancaster.
  - Cloverbud Camp fee includes programming fees, partial lunch, a snack, camp t-shirt and health insurance.
  - Intermediate and Junior Camp fee includes meals, camp t-shirt, tie dye shirt, camp programming fees and health insurance. Programs at day camp will include boating at Lake Loretta, nature, archery, crafts, recreation, campfire, inspiration, and many other activities.
- Registrations will be done online, and are on a first-come-first-serve basis starting on May 3, 2021. Families will have the option to join a waitlist if all spots fill up for the camp they want to attend.
- Registration must be completed online at [go.osu.edu/2021FCCampApp](https://go.osu.edu/2021FCCampApp), payment by credit card will be available this year. If you will be paying by check or cash, please select appropriate payment type in the registration process and send or drop off your payment (check or cash) to the OSUE office (OSU Extension, 831 College Ave., Suite D, Lancaster, OH 43130). Registration will be complete upon receipt of application and payment. Make checks payable to: **OSU EXTENSION**. There will be a \$30.00 charge for all returned checks.
- Once registration is complete, additional information will be provided including what to bring, necessary forms, and a map to camp.

## FRIEND REQUESTS:

- We know the importance of sharing a camp experience with a friend. With camp being organized in assigned groups of eight this year, we will be allowing each member to request up to 7 friends to create a group. Friends must be requested by each other to create the group. Please remember, there is no guarantee that the request can be honored, but we will do our best to make it work.
- The request form will be completed online as part of your registration, and submitted to the Extension office by June 1st. This is the only opportunity to request a camp group assignment with your friend.

  - It is helpful to us during placement to know of any concerns your 4-Her has, including but not limited to: preferred counselor, another camper they do not get along with, school or club mates they want to be with, etc.



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## HOW IS CAMP DIFFERENT IN 2021?

- Masks will be worn by everyone. Exceptions will include: 1) while participating in water-related sports, 2) while participating in strenuous activities when 6 feet can be attained AND within their cohort, and 3) when seated and actively eating
  - Campers will remain with their group and remain physically distanced from other groups. Groups will consist of 8 campers and 2 counselors
  - Camp capacity will be different for Summer 2021 to allow for adequate spacing in the lodge, dining facilities, and other activities
  - Staff members, counselors, or campers with a fever of 100.4 degrees or higher or any other COVID-19 symptoms, such as cough or shortness of breath will receive a refund and not attend camp.
  - Any staff or campers who have been in close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or is suspected of having COVID-19 will receive a refund and not attend camp.
  - As usual, campers or counselors who experience any signs or symptoms of illness will be seen by the camp nurse (s) for evaluation. Campers and counselors who experience COVID-19 symptoms will be isolated as a precaution and sent home (picked up by their family member).
  - For individuals who have been vaccinated for COVID-19, please refer to CDC guidance.
  - As usual, sanitation of camp facilities will be handled by camp directors and maintenance personnel with increased frequency including dining hall, restrooms, trash cans, and recreation spaces. Adult staff and counselors will handle increased sanitation of items used such as tables, supplies, and microphone.
  - Hand sanitizing stations will be provided throughout camp for frequent use by campers, counselors, and staff.

## Bertha Wilson Campership Information

### **Who was Bertha Wilson?**

Bertha Wilson was a sincere person who was concerned with helping others. She was at the very young age of 15 when the Great Depression hit in 1929. With hard times upon our country, jobs and money were hard to find. Bertha knew the importance of education and did very well in high school. When there was no electric in her family's house, she used kerosene to light her study. Her journey through life landed her in a course learning stenography and eventually she was hired by the Bureau of Unemployment. Through over twenty years of service Bertha found jobs for more people than anyone else in Lancaster. She was frugal with her money but was very generous in giving to her church. In her later years, Bertha set up a trust for people who had very little. Through the memory of Bertha, and her generosity, a scholarship was set up to help 4-H'ers with camp costs.

For 2021, the Bertha Wilson Trust has again decided to sponsor every Junior, Intermediate, Cloverbud with a 1/2 price scholarship if they register by June 1st!
